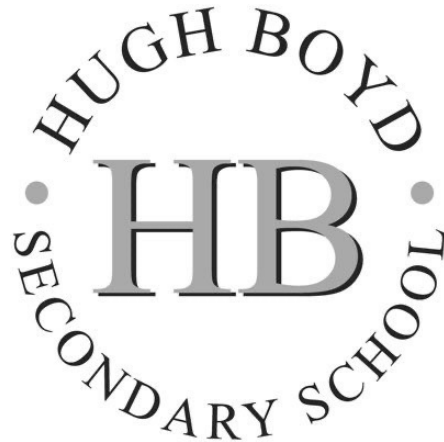

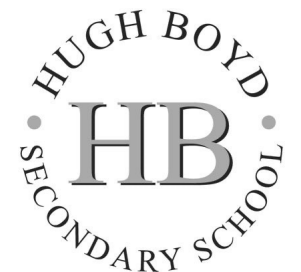

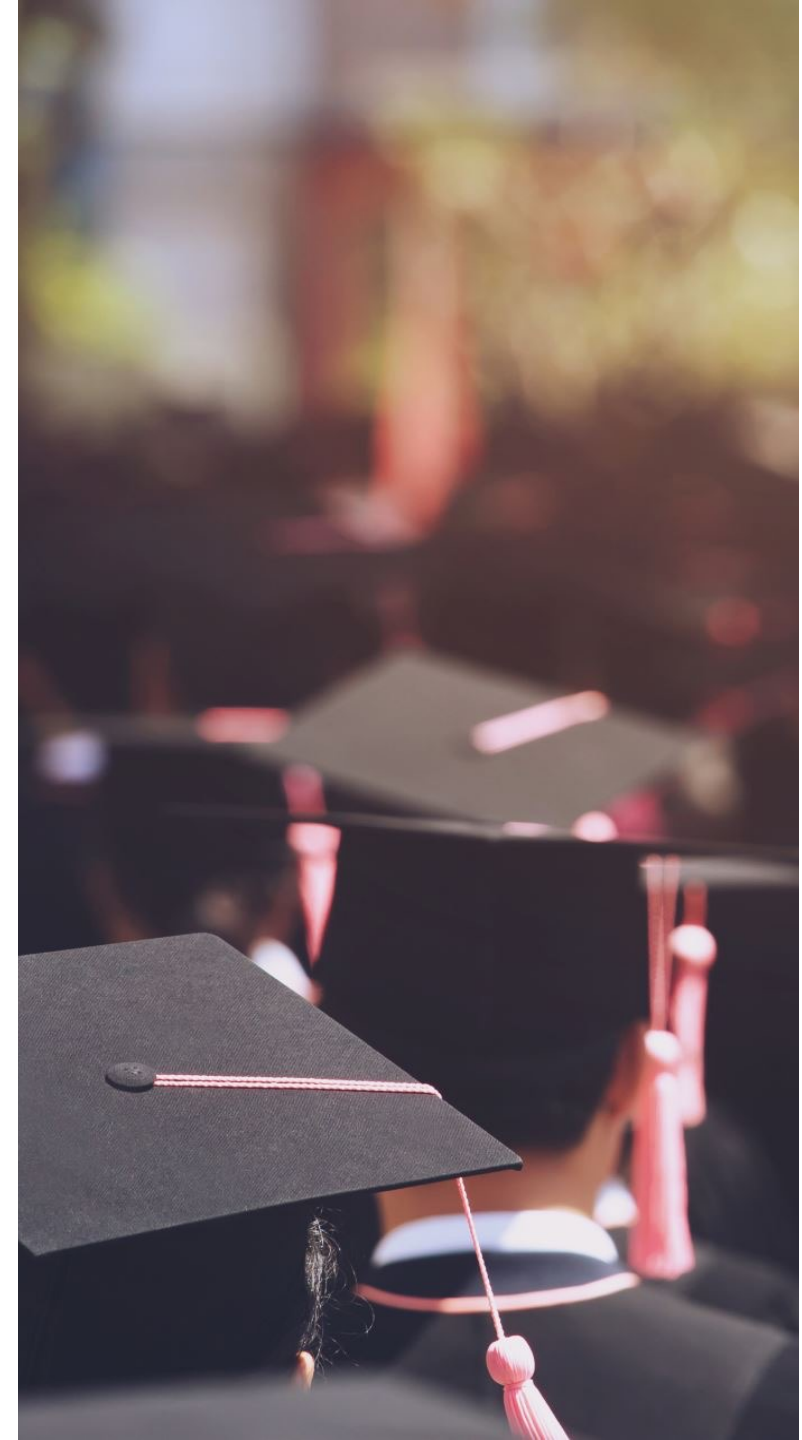

# GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

## To Graduate, students need:

- Eighty (80) credits in Grade 10 -12 (equivalent to 20 four credit courses).  
a minimum of four courses at the Grade 12 Level
- **Three Provincial Graduation Assessments**
  - Grade 10 Graduation Numeracy Assessment (GNA 10)
  - Grade 10 Graduation Literacy Assessment (GLA 10)
  - Grade 12 Graduation Literacy Assessment (GLA 12)
- An **Indigenous Focused Course** in grade 10, 11, or 12
  - English First Peoples 12
  - BC First Peoples 12 ( Social Studies)

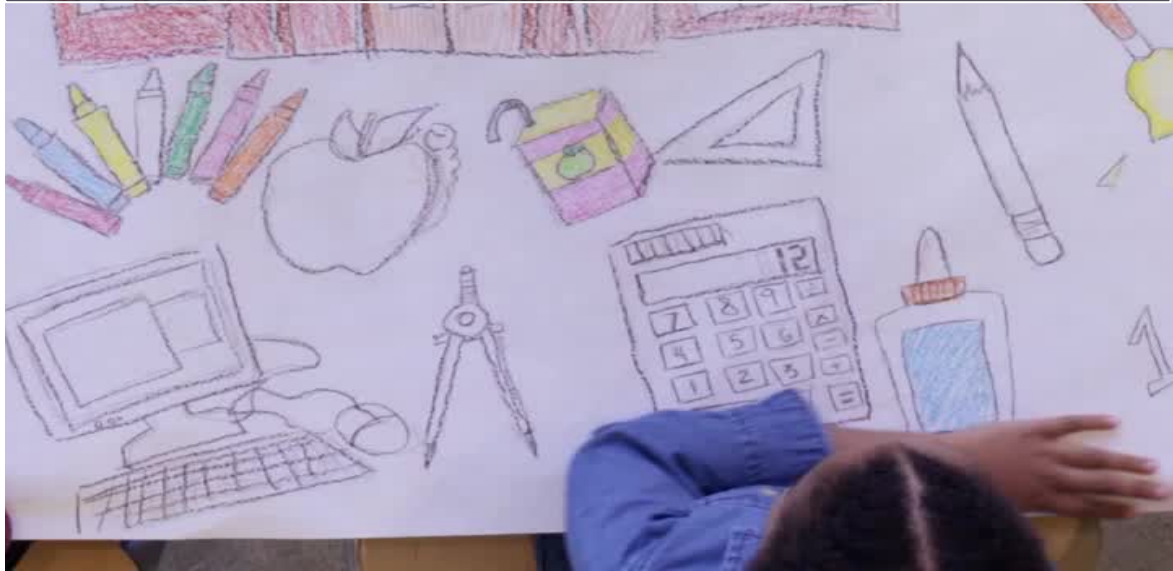

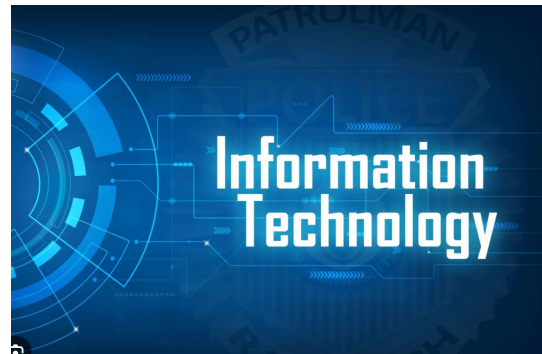

# SECOND LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

- A second language is **NOT** required for graduation

**But.....**

- A second language is **required for many major universities**

**NOTE:** In order to get a MYP certificate, all students must take three years of the same second language  
(ex: French 8, French 9 and French 10)

# New Course Offerings at Boyd Next Year

- Introductory Japanese 11
  - Beginner's Japanese
  - Upon completion, students can go directly into Japanese 11.
  
- Contemporary Music & Choir 9-12
  - provides students an opportunity to learn to perform a diverse range of music in solo and ensemble settings.
  - Prior music learning and the ability to read music is an asset, but not essential.

- Final ELL Levels will be determined in June

## Career Life Connections 12 (CLC)

- **Course is out of the timetable**
- **Includes a Capstone Project**
- **Required 4 credits for graduation**

What will you learn in CLC?

- Builds on concepts covered in CLE 10
- Explores a variety of learning outcomes that are relevant to your future ex. Careers, financial planning, personal wellness
- Completion of 30 hours volunteer/work experience

# FAILS

All required courses must be repeated, if failed  
(English, Socials, Math, Science, PE 10...)

- Register for Summer Learning or plan to repeat the course next year
- Indicate on your program planning sheet how you are going to complete this failed course

# Summer Learning - Academic Completion

- For students who received a course mark between 35 % - 49 %, a letter grade “I” (incomplete) or “F” (Fail) in:
  - English 10
  - English 11
  - Math Foundations and Pre-Calc 10
  - Science 10
- 40 hours in July (2 hours per day per course)
- If successful, the mark will be changed to C-
- Will focus on the understanding of key big ideas and competencies and will NOT cover the entire scope of courses.

# OTHER SUMMER LEARNING PROGRAMS (optional)

## **Secondary Enrichment Courses (Gr 8 to 10)**

- Will NOT cover the entire course but **preview** certain concepts.
- Prepare for the next year's courses
- Non-Credit – does not replace taking the course in school
- 2 hours each day throughout July

## **Academic Full Credit**

- These are for 4 credits
- Replaces taking the course at school
- 3.5 hours each day; July through first week of August
