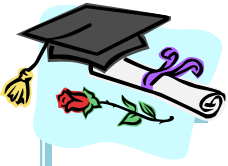
### Notice of Late Return

## Athletic Awards 2016-2017

All students who participate in Hugh Boyd Trojans Athletics are eligible for Athletic Awards. At the conclusion of each season, each coach evaluates the student athletes that play on their team. Each athlete is evaluated individually based on the ideals of leadership, sportsmanship, and citizenship as well as skill and ability, and assigned a score out of 10. A specific criterion is given to coaches for them to base their evaluation on. Athletic points are tracked and accumulated over an athlete's entire career at Hugh Boyd. Once an athlete earns a specific number of points, they are presented an award at the end of the year.

# Notice for all Grade 8 – 10 Parents

## Term 3 MYP Reporting and Overall Level of Achievement

In term 3, student report cards will feature MYP criterion levels for each subject area. As per second term, each subject has 4 criterion with a maximum achievement level out of 8. Please remember that the level is in reference to the IB rubrics, and should not be considered a direct percentage. An achievement level out of 8 is not 50%. Levels must be read in conjunction with subject rubrics, which can be found on the school website at <http://boyd.sd38.bc.ca/ib-middle-years-programme/middle-years-report-card>

In addition, there will be an IB Middle Years Programme Overall Level of Achievement out of 7. Student achievement in the 4 criterion are totaled into a number out of 32. Depending on this total, an Overall Level of Achievement is determined to provide students an overview of their work over the course of the year. This scale and its corresponding descriptors are determined by IB. See below.

Student certificates will vary depending on the participation in and achievement in the programme. The following outlines how the distribution of certificates will be determined:

### Completion with Distinction

Students have completed the requirements of the program and have achieved the following:

- Completion of all subjects with a minimum of 5 on the MYP Overall Level of Achievement in each required discipline
- Completion of a minimum 30 service hours
- Completion of the Personal Project with a minimum score of 5 out of 7
- Completion of the Interdisciplinary Unit

### Completion

Students have completed the requirements of the program and have achieved the following:

- Completion of all subjects with a minimum of 2 on the MYP Overall Level of Achievement in each required discipline
- Completion of the Personal Project with a minimum score of 2 out of 7
- Completion of a minimum of 30 service hours
- Completion of the Interdisciplinary

### Participation

Students have participated in the programme to the best of their ability, but have not completed the requirements as outlined by IB for various reasons which may include, but are not limited to:

- Enrollment in fewer than the 8 required subject areas.
- Students have entered into the last year of the programme, and could not complete all programme requirements
- Students have not completed 30 service hours
- Students have not completed the Personal Project

\*Student achievement in the Personal Project, and recorded completion of the Interdisciplinary Unit and Service Hours is posted on the office doors so students can check what they are missing.

\*\*Grades 8 & 9 completion of the interdisciplinary unit and community & service hours will also be posted. Students should ensure they have fulfilled requirements in their grade.
