For the first time in a number of years, we held a Winter Formal – great work by our grad committee and teacher sponsors, Mr. Chan and Ms. Balaciano. There is a great deal of positive spirit amongst this year's graduating class.

### **February**

It's been a great start to 2019 as we look forward to spring and continue planning for the 2019-20 school year. We have visited our Grade 7 feeder school students and current Boyd students have been entering course selections. Our counsellors held grade assemblies in early February to review the program planning process with current students. As our timetable process is driven

by student selections, it is important for students and parents to consider post-secondary and graduation requirements as courses are selected for next year. We started a pilot project – Personal Learning Time (PLT). The aim of PLT is for students to exercise self-direction and self-management in their learning, as well as to seek additional support to have more success in their courses. We will be having surveys open to students, parents, and staff in early April regarding PLT to determine next steps and potential for next year.

February has been a busy month with basketball playoffs, pep rally organized by Student Council, Boyd Biennale, the Grade 10 Personal Project Exhibition, and Night of the Notables all happening.

In addition, we would like to recognize the outstanding efforts of all our Grade 10 students who put a great deal of time and energy into their MYP Personal Projects. This would not be possible without the work of our teacher sponsors. The Personal Project Exhibition is a fantastic opportunity to showcase their work to Grade 8s and 9s, students from our feeder schools, as well as our parent community.

Our GLOW club has been organizing activities to recognize Anti-Bullying Month, with February 27<sup>th</sup> marked as Pink Day to demonstrate our commitment to creating a safe, caring, respectful, and connected school community.
