- Credits are from Grade 10, 11 and 12



# TYPICAL UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

- English 12
- Program-specific requirements
- Variety of courses taken in grade 11 and 12
  - Social Studies
  - Sciences
  - Mathematics
  - Fine and Performing Arts
  - Technologies and Trades
  - Languages



## UNIVERSITY ADMISSIONS

- 1) High school Graduation
- 2) Apply before the stated deadline
- 3) Personal Profile
- 4) English 12
- 5) 5+ additional academic courses (variable, but recommended)
  - Institution-specific (min grades in certain subjects)
  - Program specific (completion of specific 11 and 12 subjects eg. Faculty of Science or Engineering)
- 6) Competitive G.P.A. (AVERAGE ) based on
  - English 12 and other required courses depending on program

### COLLEGE ADMISSIONS

- 1) High school Graduation
- 2) English 12
- 3) Arts & Science and University Transfer may require specific Grade 11/12 subjects
- 4) Upgrading options available
- 5) Apply Early! First Come First Serve

# WHAT KIND OF GRADES DO I NEED TO BE OFFERED ADMISSION?

## UNIVERSITY ADMISSION AVERAGES

- Each sets it's own minimum grades
- Minimum vs. Competitive
- Competitiveness fluctuates
- 67% to 70% *is generally* the minimum to apply to an institution





# APPLICATION PROCESS

## ONLINE APPLICATION PROCESS

- Apply to multiple schools
  - keep options open
  - consider a college transfer
  - many programs are very competitive

• Applications require a fee for processing which is nonrefundable



## WHAT DO I NEED TO APPLY?

- Demographic information
  - Name, PEN#, phone number, etc.
  - Knowledge or record of grade 11 & 12 final grades and a list of currently enrolled in Grade 12 subjects
  - A formal transcript is not required when initially applying to most institutions
  - If required, a TVR or Official Transcript can be ordered from the office for a small fee

## STUDENT TRANSCRIPTS

- Register to the StudentTranscripts Service (STS) website. This is an online application for students to view their school marks, scholarships and transcript, and send transcripts electronically to Post-Secondary Institutions.
  - Go to the Ministry of Education's Transcripts and Certificate website at <u>http://www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca.</u> You'll need your PEN#, Full legal name, DOB, and your email address.
  - Students must register for a BC Government account, a BCeID, and log-in to StudentTranscripts Service using their BCeID.

Transcript Verification Reports provide a detailed summary of the courses you have accumulated since grade 10. Sometimes, courses on transcripts through the Ministry of Education are labelled differently than they would be on your Boyd Schedules. If you recognize a course on this report that does not sound familiar but is similar to one you completed that is not listed, this is likely the case. Please remember that counsellors have reviewed these to ensure your courses align with the Ministry's.

If you have completed or are currently enrolled in an online course, it is your responsibility to ensure that these are accounted for. Often, we do not know if you have pursued external courses, and as such, need you to contact that provider to upload your course to the Ministry of Education.

Lastly, please note that if Numeracy and Literacy Assessments have been completed, they will either have a score out of 4 or an XMT. XMT refers to an exemption, which is likely for Literacy due to it not being available to your grad year, or because of COVID19. If you do not have a score or an XMT, you need to write the appropriate assessment(s). You will be contacted.

# **TUITION BREAKDOWN**

### • University

- Approximately \$8 to \$10,000 per year plus books, student fees
- Living on campus will increase your costs by another \$6 to \$8,000

### College

- Approximately \$2 to \$4,000 per year for University transfer courses
- Career programs costs will vary according to the program
- 4 year Nursing program costs \$30,000 at Kwantlen
- Technical Institute
  - Approximately \$6000 per year for a 2 year diploma
  - Approximately \$3400 for a 3-6 month certificate
  - Approximately \$5580 for a 7-12 month certificate
  - Approximately \$830 for a 6 week apprenticeship training
  - Approximately \$6700 for a full time degree program
