Why

Students learn the importance of action and its impact on local, national, and global communities in the classroom and will extend their experience of community through personal service. In doing so, students are encouraged to be caring, concerned, responsible citizens of their local community and the world at large

How

Service learning and action can occur in the classroom and/or in the school or in local settings. We encourage students to consider their own interests as they complete their service hours in the local community and consider how their contributions relate to the global community.

Examples of Service Learning & Action

- Researching and following actions to global issues in I&S 8
- Tutoring other students and adults (volunteer)
- Making and donating masks
- Helping at the SPCA
- Giving youth art lessons
- Volunteering at senior homes and programmes

Students are required to complete a total of 10 hours *each* year of the programme and a REFLECTION
