 - Spring Girls soccer, boys Volleyball.

 - it will be a good year, Parents can be volunteer as a coach, please contact the school and we will connect you to the athletic director but we need to do some paperwork. We also have former students with a teacher sponsor. Parents can be a coach with a teacher sponsor.
- Lots of transition of our councillors, how many do we have? We now have 3 full time councillors; one is here for the month of September and be back during the busy times.
- Do parents volunteer at the school like they do at Elementary school? There is not the need like in Elementary school. You should connect with the students' teachers. Specialty if you have an area of expertise. The classrooms are full with 28 to 29 students, plus EA, support and teachers. Dry After Grad (DAG) will need help for there event that they have at the end of the school year for the grade 12 students

Is there a way to support and connect with others, there is something being planned for the incentive students. For the large group it is not commonly done.
