

Class Historian 2024 Application Form

The Class Historian(s) reflects upon the memories or history of the graduating class with a focus on the 5 years at Boyd. The speech should include highlights and stories of memorable events that have been shared by the graduating class. This speech usually has a light-hearted tone and is intended to be humorous and semi-formal. However, it must be appropriate for a school function. The successful candidate(s) will be chosen based upon the following criteria:

- The student has good public speaking skills.
- The student represents the school as shown by participation in a wide range of school activities.
- The student demonstrates citizenship and exemplifies the attributes of Boyd's IB Learner Profile.
- The student fulfills the minimum requirements needed for graduation in June of 2024.
- The student will be able to share his/her address to the graduating class while being recorded.
- The student has attended Hugh Boyd Secondary School since Grade 8.
- The student must apply individually; students must indicate below if they would be willing to share this role as co-historians with another graduating student.

Any student who wishes to be considered in representing the graduating class of 2024 as Class Historian must submit a half page (approx. 250 words) rationale to Ms. Poon on Wednesday, April 18 @ 3:00pm. No late applications will be accepted.

Your half page rationale must be typed and emailed to Ms. Poon at: rpoon@sd38.bc.ca. Submissions will be reviewed by our staff scholarship committee. The chosen Historian(s) will work with a sponsor teacher and admin to revise/edit the address.

Be sure that your email to Ms. Poon includes the following:

- Student Name (first and last)
- Student Number
- Names of two teachers who support your application
- Your willingness to work with another grad as co-historian (can be a 'yes' or 'no' response)
