Vancouver Canucks: The Ultimate Comeback

On Sunday, the Canucks mounted a historical comeback win over the Nashville Predators in Game 4 of the Western Conference First Round at Bridgestone arena. They were able to come back from a two-goal deficit to beat the Predators 4-3 in overtime. The odds were stacked against the Canucks the entire time in Game 4. They had started their third-string goaltender in the game and had trailed late in the game in the third period with Predators leading 3-1. Although Game 4 was a frustrating game to watch, the Canucks ultimately stepped up. For the first forty minutes of the gane, their chances seemed risky but the players kept pushing to score two more goals in the last three minutes of the third period.

Brock Boeser was great, leading the Canucks with a hattrick, while number nine, J.T. Miller helped with three assists. Boeser's third goal tied the game with six seconds remaining. Artur Silovs, this game being the kickoff to his playoff game career, had stopped twenty-seven out of thirty goals that night. And despite it being his first game, he had played a solid game to start his playoff career. Fortunately, he didn't face a lot of high-danger chances, he was able to control his rebounds, which kept the Canucks in the game long enough for them to have their comeback. ater, barely a minute into overtime, Elias Lindholm scored the winning goal for the Canucks past the Predators' goaltender, Juuse Saros. Thanks to that goal, Vancouver will have their first shot to advance to the second round since 2007. Despite only having shot a total of 71 goals throughout this four series game, which is considered historically low for a opening game in the playoffs, they were able to find a way to push through and win this tough game against the Nashville Predators.
