One of the most notable events during this period is the pride parades, which are celebrated extensively in Vancouver and across Canada.

Major Pride Events in Canada

Pride Toronto: This event, taking place from June 27th to June 30th, is one of the largest Pride celebrations in Canada and has evolved into a significant cultural event. It spans from Thursday to Sunday and features various activities and festivities.

Montreal Pride and Calgary Pride: These are also large-scale events recognized in their respective provinces, drawing significant participation and celebration.

Vancouver's Pride Month Celebrations

Vancouver's Pride Month events, branded as Canada Pride 2024, are scheduled from July 26th to August 4th. Some of the key events include:

Queer Rights Summit: Held at the Sheraton Vancouver Wall Centre, this summit addresses the challenges faced by the Queer Community both in Canada and globally.

VanPrideFest: A two-day festival offering live music, various activities, local vendors, and a selection of foods available from food trucks.

Vancouver Pride Parade: The highlight of Canada Pride 2024. The parade typically starts at Robson Street and Thurlow Street in central downtown, proceeds through the West End (around Denman Street), and concludes at the Sunset Beach Festival site. Participants can join the floats, dancers, and marching groups or cheer from the sidelines.


