

The Middle Years Programme (MYP)

- All students entering Hugh Boyd in grades 8 to 10 learn through the MYP.
- Students are at the centre of learning by:
  - drawing connections between all subject areas,
  - learning is explicitly linked to the world around them,
  - participating in a foreign language is required, and
  - a variety of formal and informal assessments are used to inform teaching and learning.

## The Middle Years Programme (MYP)

A unique feature of the programme is that it extends the traditional curriculum to include immersion in four themes: - approaches to teaching and learning, global contexts, and concepts.

Students also complete a Personal Project in Gr 10, which is an independent piece of work that may be an artistic production, or another form of expression. Challenges motivated students to achieve academic and personal excellence.

## Student Support Services


- Resource Tutorial Program students receive assistance with their adapted and/or modified classwork along with direct instruction in study skills and strategies
