Notice of Late Return



Our first day of school will be Sept. 2, 2025. If your child cannot attend on the first day of class, please complete the "Notice of Late Return" form and email it back to Boyd at boyd@sd38.bc.ca

The late return form (can be found on the Ms. B. Ngo - bngo@sd38.bc.ca Office school website) is to be completed for any student(s) who expect to return to school LATER THAN 12:00 pm Wednesday, Sept. 3, 2025. If a student is **not** returning on or before September 10, 2025, a school cannot reserve a spot guaranteeing the ability to be enrolled in the school. There may be a need for placement at

another school upon the students' late return.

In the event of an unforeseen critical family circumstance occurring on or find a quiet place sit, eat, and relax. First Day of School - Tuesday, September 2nd

All students will attend a Grade Assembly (new gym) and Homeroom on Tuesday, September 2. Here is the schedule for each grade:

10:00am	Grade 9/10 Assembly
11:30am	Grade 11/12 Assembly
1:00pm	Grade 8 Assembly

Homerooms will be posted at the front of the school by Friday, August 29 @ 5:00pm. Homeroom lists will be published and placed on the window at the front of the school at the end of the day on August 29. Students will be able to find their homeroom by looking through the list to find their name (listed alphabetically by last name), then cross-referencing their Homeroom, ex.1, 2, 3, etc., with the room number list next to the students' name list. Students will need to check their homeroom number, teacher and location, as each Grade Assembly will be followed by a homeroom. Leadership students and teachers will be available in the halls to assist students new to the school. New students should bring the school map with them this week.

In homeroom, students will receive information and forms, including a copy of the school calendar and instructions to download the MySchool Day app for the online calendar. This is a great tool for students to stay up to date about the block order and bell schedule. Students will also be assigned lockers and receive forms that need to be returned and completed by the end of the week.

All students will receive their schedules on the first day of school. Counsellors will continue to finalize schedules in late August. Please note that the timetable was built based on the requests from students last Spring, and students in grades 9-12 had opportunities to request course changes last year. The priority now is to complete schedules for new students, and to correct errors. If there is an error in a student's schedule, a change process will be outlined in homeroom, but please recognize that changes will be difficult at this time as most classes are full.

Homerooms September 3-5

There will be a brief **homeroom class each morning** for Wednesday - Friday of the first week to provide students with relevant information and obtain accurate attendance figures. Each homeroom teacher will also review the school expectations and procedures, distribute calendars, and answer ongoing questions students may have.

It is very important that you attend this homeroom class each day. If you do not attend homeroom during the early days of the school year, your home will be phoned. If we are unable to contact you, we will assume you are attending another school and you will be withdrawn from Boyd.

Student Schedules for 2025 - 2026

All students will get their 2025-2026 schedules on the first day of school (**September 2**). Please look at your schedule to ensure you have all the classes you need and want in order to fulfill your educational goals. Course changes will be difficult at this point. Grades 9-12 had opportunities for course changes last Spring. Any schedule corrections will be made through the counsellors via the Course Change process. Students new to the school will be seen first, followed by students with incomplete timetables. If a student has an error, they must fill out a paper course form (parent signature required). This form is available and should be returned on the table outside the Counselling Center. The deadline to submit an error form is Thursday, September 5 at 3:00 pm.

Student Information Verification, Medical Forms and Media Release Forms, Walking Field Trip

At homeroom on the first, students will receive a number of important forms:

Please ensure that all forms are signed and returned to Homeroom teachers by Friday, September 5.

Lockers

Students will be issued a **locker** by their Homeroom teacher on the first day of school. You are welcome to bring in your own lock, but you will need to record your combination with your Homeroom teacher. If you do not have a lock, you can buy one for \$10 each, and this will be yours to keep, you do not have to return it to us. Always use your locker to keep from carrying books that are too heavy and be sure to keep it clean. To ensure the safety of your belongings, always use your locker for anything valuable (do not bring money or devices to the gym change rooms), and do not share your locker combination with **ANYONE!**

Fee Statements

We will be sending home statements in Homeroom this year. All families need to set up an account for the **KEV Cash Online system**. Once those accounts have been created and students have been attached to the accounts, parents will get notification of outstanding fees. There will be many standard fees (*Basic Fee-\$28*, *Optional Grad Fees*, *Grade 8 Activity Day fee, optional Locker fee, Yearbook fee etc.*) uploaded into the system by **Tuesday, Sept 2nd**, and parents should be able to start paying immediately. Credit Card payment is an option. **Please be sure to set up your account and attach your child(ren) so you are aware of upcoming fees**.

School supplies

We recommend that students wait until they have met with each of their teachers before purchasing too many school supplies or equipment. Students should, however, bring a **pen**, a **binder and some paper** for the first few days of school. The information will come to you quickly, so you will need to stay organized.

Bell Schedule for 2025 - 2026

Boyd has a semester model. Students take four classes in first semester, and four classes in second semester. Start and end times remain 8:30 AM and 3:00 PM. Personalized Learning Time will return to Boyd, offered from 9:43 – 10:31 AM on Tuesdays and Thursdays, where students can get additional help from the teacher(s) of their choice. Attendance/Early Dismissal

Attendance is taken in each class during the day. If a student is absent first period and the school has not been notified, the school WILL phone students in Grades 8-11. If a student misses a later class, you MAY get a call from a classroom teacher, administrator or Counsellor to find out why he/she was absent. Recorded messages are also sent home at the end of the day, alerting parents to any class missed by their child via the Synrevoice system. Regular attendance is necessary for successful learning.

If a student needs to leave the school during the day, please call the office or leave a message in the Early Warning Line (604) 668-7813 informing when they should be dismissed. **Students MUST sign out at the office before he/she leaves, with phone call from a parent.**

Boyd appreciates all communication from home about students and families. In order to keep us aware of students who will be absent from school, we ask that parents use the **EARLY WARNING LINE** at **(604)668-7813**. This number is accessible 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. Please report your child's absence by calling Boyd on this number. Thank you in advance.

Meet the Teacher Evening

Meet the Teacher Evening is on Thursday, September 18 at 6:30pm. All parents and guardians will have the opportunity to meet their child's teachers, learn about the course outlines, and learning opportunities available to students. Everyone is encouraged to attend. Prior to the Meet the Teacher Evening, there will also be a Grade 8 Parent Information session for our newest Hawk families, and a Grade 12 Parent evening. Both of these sessions will be at 5:30pm. More details will be shared out shortly.

Personal Learning Time & Collaboration Time

Personal Learning Time (PLT) will occur after first block on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9:43 – 10:31am. Each PLT session is 48 minutes long, and all students are expected to participate in PLT classes. The placement of PLT later in the day will give increased opportunities for students to connect with teachers and peers, and to work on activities that are important to individuals. As a community we will support students to make wise choices with their PLT time. More information about options and expectations during PLT will be shared with students as we start the school year.

Boyd also has **Collaboration Time** eight times throughout the year where teachers meet and plan new activities and lesson ideas for their classes. During this time, students have opportunities to collaborate with peers, self-study and/or choose an activity of interest.

Collaboration time happens on the first Wednesday of each month except September and April, starting October 1. Collaboration Time runs from 8:30-9:45am, and classes start at 9:55 on these days. End of day dismissal on all these days is unchanged at 3:00 PM.

Protect Personal Belongings

The best defense against acts of theft is to not to bring valuable items to school. Protect your belongings and do not leave money or other valuables in an unattended bag, locker or changing room. Students should **LEAVE VALUABLES AT HOME!**

Academic Honesty

We believe that every student has the responsibility to participate actively in their own learning. When faced with problems to solve or assignments to complete, it is the thinking and the effort a student puts into researching, reading, writing and re-writing that allows one to truly learn.

Similarly, submitting the work of another student, tutor, parent, friend, etc. as your own work (even though it has been properly footnoted and referenced) is plagiarism and not acceptable at school. This applies equally to written work and projects (ex. Web design, tech projects, artwork, and photos). Tutors or AI should not write, re-write or significantly edit large sections of work for a student. It is the student's responsibility to avoid deliberate or accidental plagiarism and to verify and account for all their own work and learning.

Teen Mental Health

Anxiety, depression and other mental disorders can affect between 15% - 20% of adolescents at some point during their teen years and we anticipate some of these numbers could rise as we emerge from the pandemic. Good mental health is more than just a lack of mental illness. As life is full of ups and downs, having the knowledge and strategies to cope with stressors can be effective in preventing a mental disorder from occurring during adolescence or later in life. Please be sure to communicate with your child about how they are feeling and if you need some help, please contact our counsellors. **Being a teenager has never been filled with more pressure, and we need to be aware of the signals if our kids are struggling**.

Learning Centre Help

Boyd is continuing with its Learning Resource Centre model. Students are now welcome to attend the Resource centre on a drop-in basis, provided they have permission from their classroom teacher. Any student in need of some extra assistance in a subject area may come to the Resource Centre to get assistance from the teachers in the room. If your child can benefit from this extra assistance, please remind them to advocate for themselves and take advantage of this tremendous support. It is open to all students and can also be accessed during PLT.

Pick up/Drop off

Help us make Hugh Boyd a safe school and a good neighbor by doing what you can to ease the traffic congestion in the area. Number 1 Road can be very busy, and we encourage parents and all other drivers not to enter the parking lot from the West side of the building. We also encourage students to walk or bike to school. If you **MUST** pick up or drop off, please do so before 8:00 AM and do not stop in the parking lot, rather proceed to the drop off area in front of the school.

Smoking and Vaping

Smoking is a serious health hazard, and students and adults are **NOT PERMITTED** to smoke anywhere on school property. We encourage healthy habits at Boyd and will actively dissuade students found smoking/vaping anywhere on school property

Acceptable Use of Personal Digital Devices

Cellphones and other electronic devices are not to be used, seen or heard during class time, unless permission has been granted by the classroom teacher. These can be very valuable learning tools, but they need to be used appropriately and must not become a distraction. We ask that parents **DO NOT** call or text your child while they are in class. In case of emergency, please call the school office at (604)668-6615 and we will contact your child for you.

According to the District's Acceptable Use of Student Personal Digital Device Policy, the Guidelines for Secondary School (Grades 8 to 12) are:

- o Students should not use Personal Digital Devices during instructional time, unless permission is granted by the supervising staff for educational purposes.
- When not permitted, personal digital devices should be powered off, secured inside a student's backpack, locker or secured location.
- o Personal digital devices are not to be used in areas where privacy is expected or required.
- Access to social media platforms from personal digital devices may be restricted on the school wireless network during instructional time.
- The district does not assume responsibility for the safety, security, loss, repair or replacement of any personal digital devices. The security and storage of personal digital devices is the sole responsibility of the student/user.

RICHMOND DISTRICT CAREERS PROGRAMS (GRADE 10-12)

- The Career Programs Office offers students in Richmond School District with opportunities to explore a variety of career options while still in high school. Whether students decide to pursue college, university or work after high school, these options open doors and allow students to:
 - o get a head start in a chosen career path while still in high school
 - o acquire skills relevant to today's labor market needs
 - o have flexibility and choice with respect to how, when and where learning takes place
- The *Youth Train in Trades* programs offer hands-on skills acquisition through post-secondary technical training to students in grades 11/12 (apply in grades 10/11). The first level of tuition is FREE (savings of ~\$2500-4000) paid for by the Richmond School Board.
- The Youth Work in Trades program means students aged 15-19 "earn while they learn", acquiring high school credits and industry credentialing in recognized trade, while in high school.
- Throughout the school year, the <u>Career Programs Office</u> strives to engage students, educators, parents, and the Richmond community to learn more about the skilled trades and other career areas by offering a variety of professional learning opportunities, activities, and events. Our office is available for classroom presentations and can facilitate student try-a-trade experiences at various post-secondary schools. (Currently, these are virtual.)
