* Level 4 and 5 Students will be supported by a supplemental ELL Teacher

SUMMER LEARNING PROGRAMS (optional)

Secondary Enrichment Non-Credit Courses

- Will NOT cover the entire course but **review** certain concepts.
- Prepare for next year's courses or review this year's courses
- Non-Credit – does not replace taking the course in school
- 2 hours each day throughout July

Academic Full Credit

- These are for 4 credits per course
- Replaces taking the course at school
- 3.5 hours each day; July through first week of August

NOTE: If you are taking a course over the summer, please tell us which course you are taking in the “Notes for Counsellor” Section on your online planning

Ex. Taking Science 10 in Summer School, please put me in Physics



Grade 9 students, it's time to select your Grade 10 courses for the 2026-2027 school year!

All students **MUST** select a total of **EIGHT (8) core and elective courses**, plus **TWO (2) alternate elective courses**.

Please use your Program Planning Sheet as a guide for selecting courses.

Required Courses

Grade 10 students must select a course package containing their core courses.
